Dave also gave us a vision for the future, talked about grants that the committee is trying to obtain to start implementation of some of the ideas, and stated that they will not know about the grants until March or April of 2006. Questions and comments were heard.

Randy Peck and a few of his neighbors from Hamilton Street came in to discuss a problem they are having with their drinking water ever since a water main broke on Salmon Creek Road last spring. Randy and his neighbors looked in to getting filters for the four houses with the problem. Tony Verno will contact the Water Dept. and look into the problem.
