Public Comment: No one wished to comment.

Emily Hamilton from PathStone, gave a brief presentation on a Farm worker Housing Rehabilitation Grant. The program will assist in capital repairs of farm worker housing. The proposed program would cover 60% of the rehabilitation costs with the farm covering the rest of the costs. To qualify, a structure would be an existing farm worker house with structural, electrical, heating, or septic system issues or a trailor built before 1976 with lead paint or to replace a manufactured home in disrepair. After the grant is awarded, an interested and eligible farm would sign a promissory note that places a 5-year lien on the property requiring the house to be used as farm worker housing for 5 years. Change of use will necessitate repayment of a portion of the grant. There are 3 towns that are interested in applying for this grant, Sodus, Rose, and Williamson. The maximum amount that can be requested is \$ 400,000.00, and that would be for all 3 towns.

Supervisor Hoffman made a motion, seconded by Councilman Verno, to accept and/or file the letters and other forms of communication.

"It shall be a violation of this chapter for any person to:

A. Consume any alcoholic beverage in any public place within the Town.

B. Have in his possession an open or unsealed container of an alcoholic beverage while in any public place for the purpose of consuming such alcoholic beverage by himself or by another in any public place." and

WHEREAS: the aforementioned tent will be located in the parking lot of the Pultneyville Grill,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Williamson Town Board hereby declares that on July 21, 2012 between the hours of 12:00 noon and 10:00 p.m. provisions of A and B cited above of Chapter 54, Section 54-3 of Town Code shall not be enforced for the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in the parking area of the Pultneyville Grill.
